The Ivy League School began fifty years ago as a one room schoolhouse, and was expanded into a summer day camp. The camp grew (enrollment today is nearly 750 children) and facilities were expanded to encompass sixteen landscaped acres. Activities and programs took place outdoors or in several different buildings throughout the grounds, as they do today at Ivy League School.

The school's reputation and its enrollment also grew. Today, Ivy League School not only exceeds national standards for academic achievement, it has created a community where students are exposed to a myriad of developmental experiences, from after school programs including music, gymnastics, soccer, and foreign language programs in French, Spanish and Mandarin, to community outreach. Ivy League School also fosters ethics and a caring community. It is distinguished in the wider community, giving freely of its facilities, assets and efforts, to charitable endeavors.

Ivy League School is now at capacity. To fulfill its mandate and long range plan of being Long Island's premier private school, it must be able to grow to meet our communities' needs. Ivy League aims to educate the growing numbers of children who want to enroll and expand its role as the leader of Suffolk County's academic transformation, while maintaining its celebrated low teacher-student ratios.

T H E C A M P A I G N

TWO NEW GRADES—In response to the community, as part of its vision, and in anticipation of a future high school, Ivy League School is adding grades seven and eight.

NEW CONSTRUCTION—Ivy League School will build a new 12,000 sq ft facility which will add much-needed centralized classroom and studio space to house the majority of the school's disciplines and the anticipated increased numbers of students.

In keeping with Ivy League's leading role in the community, they will construct a new playing field that will meet current as well as future needs of its student body, and the needs for playing space of various teams from throughout Suffolk County.

SCHOLARSHIPS—In every school and every institution of higher education, scholarships are necessary in order to enable gifted and talented students to attend and realize their full academic and intellectual potentials. The Ivy League School Foundation will extend its vital scholarship program to nearby Suffolk County communities and the children whose parents could not otherwise afford to send them to Ivy League School.

Additionally, The Ivy League School Foundation will provide full scholarships for a one week camp experience for children who would otherwise never have an opportunity to attend a private day camp.

TEACHING FELLOWSHIPS—Salaries in private schools are lower than those in public schools; yet, Ivy League's teachers choose to teach and remain here for years. At Ivy League, faculty are not bound by regimented bureaucratic systems or methodologies but are given latitude to teach as they deem best; they are passionate about teaching, and welcome the opportunity to teach in a top-notch private school.

Tuition alone cannot provide nearly the resources and compensation these gifted teachers need. To help meet some of those needs, and to ensure that each and every teacher at Ivy League School has the most comprehensive training in existence, The Ivy League School Foundation is instituting a fellowship program. This fellowship program aims to provide ongoing education and training for faculty to enhance their methodology and add to their already-impressive credentials.
